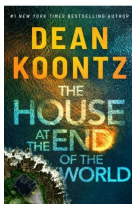

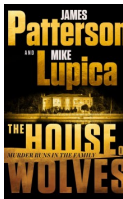
Exiles

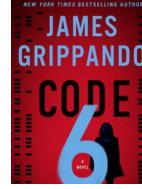
The House of Wolves

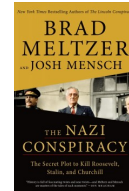

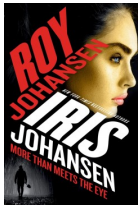

A Cotton Malone adventure, in which the discovery of a lost historical document challenges the global might of the United States. (2/21)

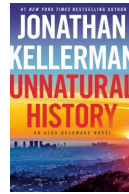


Code Name Sapphire

A woman must rescue her cousin's family from a train bound for Auschwitz in this riveting tale of bravery and resistance. (2/7)



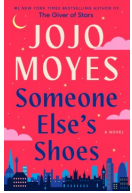
More Than Meets the Eye

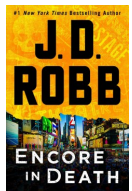
Someone Else's Shoes

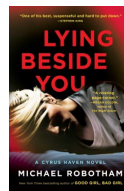
The Angel Maker

Encore in Death

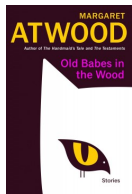
by J.D. Robb

An innocent father serving a life sentence for the murder of his own son must break out of prison to uncover the truth. (3/14)



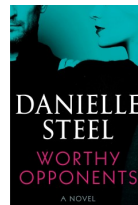
Collateral Damage

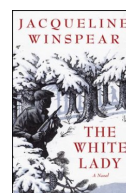
Worthy Opponents
